PSSA Discipline Policy

Classroom management is left to each individual teacher. Teachers are expected to handle discipline in their classrooms on a daily basis. Teachers will be responsible for contacting parents by telephone or in writing to inform them of any discipline problems in the classroom. Teachers will choose a consequence for breaking rules that may include, but not be limited to, detention, missed PE/recess, missed Enrichment, missed Friday dress-down privilege or loss of other school activities/privileges and/or writing a summary of the offense and the consequence.

When a student receives their 4th referral, they will be given a suspension. A student is expelled when they receive their 4th suspension.

If a pattern of misbehavior develops, and classroom instruction is disrupted, the teacher will notify a member of the administrative staff to assess the need for a parent conference involving the classroom teacher, the parents, the student, and administration. The administrative staff will determine the need for further action which may include, but not be limited to, suspension or expulsion from school. The administrative staff will assess specific behavior on an individual basis. Behaviors that may warrant immediate suspension/expulsion may include, but not be limited to, insubordination, acts of violence, overt disrespect, threats, bullying, leaving school property without permission and other unsafe behavior.

We are here to teach the students math, science, reading, and history; but we are also here to teach them life skills. Our goal is to help students become productive members of society. It is imperative they learn respect for authority, responsibility, accountability for their actions, and the importance of following rules in order for us to provide a safe learning environment for every student at Pathways Private School.

PSSA Graduation and Attendance Policies

Florida State Compulsory Attendance Laws require students to attend a minimum of **180 actual school days or the hourly equivalent (900 hours)**. Students missing more than 4 days in a grading period will be considered truant and a conference with the teacher, Principal and parent/s will be held. A Doctor's excuse or note from the parent should accompany the student upon returning to school after an absence. Students are NOT allowed to work from home instead of coming to school.

PSSA Grade Changes, Incomplete Grades, and Course Recovery

Grade Change Policy

Grades submitted by teachers at the end of the term are final and are not subject to change on the basis of revision of judgement such as a new exam or additional work completed after the original grade has been submitted. The Teacher will consult with the Principal before any grade changes are made and will be approved ONLY if one of the following reasons has occurred:

1. Correction of error in grading, or entering a grade wrong
2. Submitting a final grade for an "I" grade (see Incomplete Grade Policy below)

Any correction of a grade must take place within one year of the start date of the course in which the grade was assigned.

Incomplete Grades Policy

An Incomplete "I" is a temporary grade which may be given at the Teacher's discretion to a student for the purpose of unit/missed work recovery (Semester Recovery, SR).

The following provisions for Incomplete grades apply:

- Specific understanding/contract with completion date between student and teacher of what is expected to successfully pass a class
- Before the end of the term, the student and Teacher complete the incomplete Grade form.
- The student has one term to demonstrate mastery and earn the credit before the grade turns into an "F"
- "I"s must be updated within one year of the start date of the course in which the grade was assigned

Course/Credit Recovery Policy

Students who have earned a failing grade in a core course may be approved to earn credit through the Credit Recovery program. Permission must be obtained from the Principal and Teacher in order for a student to repeat a course. Students passing credit recovery courses will receive a grade of 70% or lower, whichever is lowest. Students may repeat up to 3 courses for course recovery.

Student Athletes should not use credit recovery. The NCAA does not recognize courses recovered through credit recovery.

PSSA Dress Code

Tops- Dress Code T-shirt that is sold in the Front Office.

Bottoms- Any jeans, pants, capris, shorts, or skirts that fit properly (cannot be too large or too tight or sag off the backside. Bottoms must be worn at the waist). Shorts and skirts must be no shorter than 6 inches above the middle of the kneecap. **Jeans or pants may not have rips or holes in them above the knee. If jeans/pants/bottoms have holes, rips, shreds or tears above the knees, something must be worn underneath the jeans to cover the skin.** No pajamas. No sweat pants. Students must look neat.

Shoes- Any sneakers, loafers, or low heel boots and shoes are allowed. Shoes may not be open toe or open back. **Sandals, slides and flip flops are not allowed.**

Jewelry- Minimal jewelry allowed. **No body piercings. No temporary tattoos. No faux piercings. Any piercings that show that not located in the ears must be removed or covered by a band aid that is worn ALL OF THE TIME a student is on campus or attending a school event.**

PSSA Food & Snack Policy and Extended Time on Campus Policies

Food & Snacks

Pathways School offers a Free Breakfast, Free Lunch and Snacks daily for all students. If students want to bring their own food from home, they may use our microwaves. We do not provide refrigerators.

Students are NOT ALLOWED to have food or snacks delivered by any food service or anybody bringing outside food. Students may use the vending machines on campus for meals and snacks. Students will be allowed to leave campus on Fridays to eat lunch nearby and then return to school.

Extended Time on Campus

Class hours for High School are 9:00 – 2:30 every week day except Wednesdays. Wednesdays are Early Release Days and school gets out at 1:30. Students are only allowed to stay after school (later than 2:30 or 1:30 on Wednesdays) if they are on a sports team and there is practice, a game or activity OR if the student waits for a sibling in K-8 that gets out and leaves at 3:00 (or 2:00 on Wednesdays).

_____ **Hours-** Pathways School hours of operation are 6:30 a.m. – 5:30 p.m. Parents will be charged a late fee for any student not picked up by 5:30 p.m. The late fee must be paid by the following day. **Class hours are 9:00 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday. Wednesday hours are 9:00 – 1:30.**

_____ **Registration-** The full registration fee is due at time of registration. **The registration fee is non-refundable.** Copies of the following items are necessary to complete your child's folder: **birth certificate, parent/guardian driver's license, student's insurance card, current physical and shot records.** Your student will not be allowed to start school with an incomplete registration folder.

_____ **Curriculum Fee-** This fee covers the curriculum and resources that are used during the year. **The Curriculum Fee is non-refundable.**

_____ **Tuition-** Tuition covers the academic year for class hours. Tuition is paid in 10 payments. The first one is due in August and the last one in May. . **The monthly tuition is ONLY paid by DIRECT DEBIT. A late fee of \$25.00 is due for any NSF on the Direct Debit.** Days missed for illness, holidays, personal reasons, vacations, suspensions, etc. are not deductible. Refunds will not be made.

_____ **Parent/Guardian Conduct-** Rude and obnoxious behavior from parents/guardians on school campus will not be tolerated. **We have a ZERO TOLERANCE Policy for any threats or violence against our staff, students, family members of students/staff or Pathways School property.** Any such behavior will result in the family being asked to leave our school and the obligation agreement will be in effect. Please remember that we are a place of business where students are always present. We ask that you are fully clothed while on school property and that your clothing has no inappropriate language or graphics. Smoking is strictly prohibited on school property. **NO CELL PHONE USE IS ALLOWED INSIDE PATHWAYS SCHOOL-** please do not take or make phone calls inside our school.

_____ **Returned Checks-** Parents will be charged a fee of \$25.00 for each returned check. Repeat offenders will be required to pay with cash, credit card or money order only.

_____ **Absences and Tardiness-** It is the parent's responsibility to see that their student is at school on time every day. Any student arriving after 9:01 a.m. will be marked tardy. Absences and tardiness reflect on the student's report card and permanent cumulative file.

_____ **School Uniform-** All students, 9-12, must be clean, neat and complete uniform every day. Students not dressed in proper uniform may not attend class. Pathways' T-shirts may be purchased at Pathways School.

_____ **Conferences-** Conferences with the classroom teacher or the Principal may be scheduled by calling the front office or sending a note with your child. DO NOT try to meet with the teacher at drop-off or pick-up time. At these times, teachers are responsible for their students and cannot meet with parents.

_____ **Visitor Policy-** All parents are considered visitors and must check in at the front office. All classroom visits must be scheduled with the classroom teacher and Principal prior to the visit.

_____ **Drop off and pick up-** If you need to come inside for or with your student, please park in a designated parking space. Per the State Fire Marshall, cars cannot be left unattended in the pick-up/drop-off circle. PLEASE be courteous, kind, and exercise caution and patience while in the parking lot. Let's keep our students safe!

_____ **Student Pick-Up During School Hours-** No student is permitted to leave the school during school hours unless he/she is signed out through the school office by a parent/guardian. The parent/guardian must come in and sign the student out for the day.

_____ **Overdue Account Balances-** A zero balance is required at all times on accounts. School records, including report cards, will be held for accounts with overdue balances. Students with overdue account balances will not be able to participate in the end of the year activities. Past due accounts must be paid with cash or money order for records to be released.

_____ **Damage-** Campus property, textbooks/curriculum or personal property destroyed, damaged or lost by any student will be replaced or repaired immediately at the parent/guardian's expense.

_____ **Student Withdrawal/Obligation Agreement-** Our school is staffed based on the number of students enrolled. If a child is withdrawn for any reason (including expulsion), without at least 30 days written notice, there is an Obligation fee that is owed and any additional fees are required before student records will be transferred. Payment must be made with cash, money order, or credit card. Files of student who leave owing money will be sent to our Collections Department, where additional fees will be assessed. Please refer to the PATHWAYS SCHOOL WITHDRAWAL POLICY FOR 9-12 STUDENTS for the amount you are obligated to pay if you withdraw your student(s) during the school year.

_____ **Miscellaneous-** GUM IS NEVER ALLOWED ON CAMPUS! All 9-12 students are dismissed from campus at 2:30 daily (except for Wednesday when dismissal is at 1:30) and must leave unless they are paying for Extended Hours.

_____ **Policy Violation Disclaimer-** PSSA reserves the right at its sole discretion to make the decision to terminate a student's enrollment for repeated discipline policy violations or violations of the Parent Code of Conduct.

_____ **State Regulations-** As mandated by State Law, a current physical, immunization record and birth certificate must be on file at Pathways School within 30 days of the child's first day of school.

_____ **Anti-Discrimination Notice-** Pathways does not discriminate in enrollment based on race, religion, or gender.

PSSA Withdrawal Policy for 9th - 12th Students

This signed and notarized policy is in effect throughout the duration of your student's enrollment at PSSA.

PLEASE READ THIS POLICY AND MAKE SURE THAT YOU UNDERSTAND IT.

If you choose to withdraw and leave Pathways School, you must submit a letter in writing that GIVES YOUR 30-DAY NOTICE AND YOU MUST STAY UNTIL 30 DAYS FROM THE DAY YOU SUBMIT THE LETTER TO THE OFFICE.

If you do not give written notice and stay the 30 days OR you leave before your 30 days is up OR your child is expelled, you owe an OBLIGATION AGREEMENT.

Your OBLIGATION AGREEMENT is the remainder of the tuition for the entire school year. Tuition is \$9,000. If you leave without staying the 30 days, you owe 9,000 minus the amount you have paid FOR TUITION, or a scholarship has paid for tuition. You must pay this if you do not follow the guidelines for withdrawing and attending for the school days in the 30 days after you turn in your letter of withdrawal.

The obligation fee must be paid in full, and you must have a zero balance on your account for any records to be transferred.

I understand that if I withdraw my child or leave for any reason, including expulsion, I must give a 30-day notice in writing and attend all school days within the 30 days or I will have to pay the Obligation Agreement.

PSSA reserves the right at its sole discretion to make the decision to terminate a student's enrollment for repeated discipline policy violations or violations of the Parent Code of Conduct.
